The weekly meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was held at New World Landing on a cold Tuesday January 15, 2019. Members and quests received a warm welcome at the door from new member Sorna Khakzad and longtime member Jimmy Jones. Dale Jordan and Charles Kahn teamed up and did a great job on the raffle. President Betty Roberts called the meeting to order and led us in the Four Way Test. Ted Brown led us in an inspiring prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. The moment in History for this week was presented by the Rotary Rooters and gave us a lesson on the origins and ups and downs of Mardi Gras celebrations in Pensacola today. Beginning in France, moving to the new world in New Orleans, Mobile and in 1900 to Pensacola and with a few ups and downs ending with the Mardi Gras celebrations we know today. His plea is that we all consider what we can do to build back and strengthen the core values or "common values' within our community. After Sheriff Morgan responded to several questions, President Betty thanked all who served and the meeting was adjourned.
