#### WEEK IN REVIEW 1/24/2023

On the Tuesday of the fourth week of January, Ol' Man Winter decided to visit Pensacola and provide the members of the Pensacola Rotary Club a freshening wind as they entered the Pensacola Bay Center for the weekly Club Meeting. Once inside, President Bruce Partington welcomed the Rotarians with the Four Way Test. Rotarian Vince Curry, everyone's favorite University of the South alum, then provided a wonderful prayer and led the Pledge of Allegiance. Past President Paul Tobin read a heartwarming resolution that honors a life well lived by Rotary Dante Kahn. Paul Harris Fellow recognition was bestowed upon Rotarian Nicole Gislason

President Bruce reminded Rotarians of the opportunity to serve in the Rotary Against Hunger event at Manna Food Bank on February 25, 2023. Time slots are available for the two shifts. Another reminder that President Bruce offered up was that interested/potential members of Pensacola Rotary Club are able to have three free meals as they visit the club.

The date of January 24th has proven to be packed with a litany of historical events throughout the centuries, many of which President Bruce highlighted. Some Rotarians are saying that their favorite includes FDR and Churchill concluding their Casablanca conference on January 24, 1943, while other Rotarians celebrate the fact the first Apple Mac went on sale on January 24, 1984. It was once again Sewanee's favorite son Rotarian Vince Curry's turn to grace the front of the room as he held the winning ticket in the day's raffle that allowed him to claim a whopping \$4 of the \$75 pot.

Rotarian Judy Bense was next up, and she delivered a delightful dose of Sunshine that was sure to fill each Rotarian's spirit. In between a joke about chickens and a joke that provided insight on how to make money off a dead donkey, Rotarian Judy recognized two visiting Rotarians from Suburban West and Omaha, Nebraska. After leading a serenade of Rotarian Ron Martin with "Happy Birthday," Rotarian Judy shared a Pensacola factoid with about Pensacola Dairy Company being on the site of present-day Pensacola Bay Center.

Immediate Past President Ed Wonders had the pleasure of introducing Pensacola Rotary Club member Grover Robinson, IV as the day's speaker. Rotarian Grover was the commissioner of Escambia County district 4 from November 2006 to November 2018. He was elected mayor of Pensacola on November 27, 2018. A seventh generation Pensacolian, Rotarian Grover

received a bachelor's degree in economics from Birmingham Southern College and worked as a commercial lender for AmSouth Bank, returning to Pensacola in 1995. Since leaving office on November 22, 2022, Rotarian Grover has spent part of his time "breaking in a new puppy and walking Jerry Maygarden" by the airport.

It was with the glow of a Rotarian that is refreshed and recharged that Rotarian Grover shared his reflections on his time as Mayor. His four years were marked by Social Justice, COVID and hurricanes. It was because of these external influences that Rotarian Grover gained insight into the psychology of people. Rent rolls in the City were high; property values at all time highs; and people were still not in good moods. Rotarian Grover and City Officials navigated these influences while also moving Pensacola forward. In the most recent completed fiscal year, the carry forward for the General Fund was \$5 million and the carry forward in LOST was \$2.8 million. Enterprise funds are at record levels. Rotarian Grover highlighted the continued growth of the airport and ST Engineering's impact. He also mentioned Pensacola Energy replacing the cast iron piping that was providing natural gas to the community both locally and in the county.

The Port of Pensacola continues to find its rhythm of being a niche port that is successful by being good at what it does. The Port's relationship with US Sailing's American Magic is an example of a successful niche port. The port was once ranked 15 out of 15 in the state of Florida and now has climbed into the top 10. Both the Port of Pensacola and Downtown Pensacola are successful because efforts were made to insure each is compatible with the other.

The success of Pensacola is due to the fact that people want to be here. To make this happen, amenities for citizens such as the walkability of areas, Scooter Program for Downtown and stop signs in various neighborhoods have helped enhance the attract ability of Pensacola. The Parks & Recreation Department has or is in the process of providing upgrades for Legion Field, Magee Field, Hunter Pool, Vickery Center Pool, Roger Scott Tennis Courts, Hitzman Park Soccer Complex, Skate Park and various dog parks and playgrounds. The Pensacola Police Department continues to strengthen the relationship between communities, neighborhoods and the police department.

Rotarian Grover concluded his remarks by sharing his strong belief that Pensacola will continue to experience great things and has a bright future.
