President Betty introduced our guest speaker Ildi Hosman, Area President

of Junior Achievement of Northwest Florida. Mrs. Hosman grew up in nearby Milton, graduated from the University of West Florida, and has been the Executive Director of Junior Achievement of Northwest Florida for the past two-and-a half years.

2019 marks Junior Achievement's 60th anniversary in Pensacola and 100th nationally. Our speaker asked for a show of hands by members who had served as JA volunteers. Many members raised their hands.

JA partners with business people who volunteer their time in our local schools. Sharing their backgrounds and hands-on experience, they help young people understand the economics of life.

Last school year, Junior Achievement of Northwest Florida reached over 5,300 students with financial literacy education in over 230 classrooms in 29 schools with the assistance of more than 100 volunteers. There are several ways to volunteer, including assisting at Junior Achievement career days.

Funding for Junior Achievement programming comes solely from grants and corporate and individual donations. Mrs. Hosman thanked us for the financial support RCOP has provided in the past.

She also encouraged us to participate in this year's annual fund raiser, Mardi Gras Bowl 2019. The event will be held March 8-9 at Cordova Lanes. Proceeds from the fund raiser typically fund about one third of Junior Achievement of Northwest Florida's yearly expenses.

Before concluding her presentation our speaker fielded several questions from some of those in attendance.
