#### **Rotarians Connect Over Fellowship and Airport Insights**

Spring was definitely in the air as our Rotary Club gathered at the Pensacola Yacht Club for our recent meeting, where fellowship and a delicious meal were enjoyed by all. The welcoming committee of Bob Rodgers and Scott Sallis greeted members, and the energetic duo of Dr. Saunders and Jessica Scholl were busy selling raffle tickets.

President Henry got the meeting underway with an inspiring reminder of the significant impact of Rotary, noting that our club is part of a network of over 44,000 Rotarians across the United States making a real difference both locally and globally. Laura Gilliam thoughtfully led us in prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance. President Henry then took a moment to acknowledge the success of the recent RYLA camp and express gratitude to the many members who have supported this vital program for countless years. This year's camp saw an enthusiastic participation of 78 high school students, and we look forward to a program in June for a more in-depth look at their experience.

Sally Fox, brought her usual cheer as she welcomed our guests, visitors, and celebrated our members with birthdays. Charlie Sherrill was the sole birthday honoree present and gamely endured a spirited rendition of "Happy Birthday" from the club – Happy Birthday, Charlie!

The anticipation for the ever-growing raffle continues, and this week Sally Fox, fresh from her Sunshine duties, was delighted to claim the grand prize of \$8!

Our program for the afternoon focused on a key element of our community: the Pensacola International Airport. We were fortunate to hear

from the airport's Director, Matt Coughlin, and Air Services Manager, Todd Payne. They provided fascinating insights into the operations of our 1400-acre airport, impressively nestled within the city limits, which continues to break passenger records while strategically planning for future growth. Pensacola's airport ranks an impressive 87th out of 420 nationwide, maintaining its position as the busiest airport between New Orleans and Jacksonville, and south to Tampa and Orlando. The statistics shared were remarkable: 3 million passengers in 2024, a 14% increase from 2023 and a staggering 104% increase since 2013. Cargo movement with UPS also saw a significant 120% jump compared to 2024.

Looking ahead, Matt and Todd detailed the planned expansion project for the concourse and security area, outlining the location and sharing initial renderings for the nearly \$100 million endeavor currently in the design phase. Funding remains a key challenge, and while grants and other avenues are being explored, some form of bonding is likely for a project of this magnitude. They highlighted the recent opening of a new parking lot off Tippen Avenue, which is already experiencing full capacity during peak travel times. Other noteworthyupdates included American Airlines being the leading carrier in Pensacola, the addition of Contour as the 9th airline serving our city, the upcoming launch of a new cell phone waiting lot to ease terminal traffic, and the positive news of improved TSA operations thanks to increased staffing and new equipment.

The meeting was adjourned shortly after 1:00 PM. Respectfully submitted, Clark Merritt.
