WEEK IN REVIEW 03/19/2019

The regular meeting of the Downtown Rotary was held at New World Landing on March 19th. Members were greeted at the door by Jeff Powell. Raffle tickets were sold by Lisa York and Janet Pilcher. The meeting was called to order by President Betty who led us in the 4 Way Test. She reminded us about the conference that is coming up in April and is being held in San Destin. The raffle of \$44.00 was won by Buck Lee. John Tice led us in Prayer and Pledge. Buck Lee took to the podium to deliver on Sunshine. He introduced our two military guests, 2 visiting Rotarian's and read off the birthdays. Rick Fountain introduced our guest speaker Malcolm Thomas, the Escambia County School Superintendent.

Malcolm Thomas has been as Superintendent of the Escambia County School District since 2008. He served in the 101st Airborne Division of the Army after graduating from Tate High School. He graduated from the University of West Florida with a bachelors' degree and went on to receive his masters' degree. He taught special education at Tate High School for 8 years and where he was named Escambia County Teacher of the year. He was a finalist for the Florida Teacher of the Year.

He has spent over 30 years as a teacher and administrator in Escambia County. He oversees 5500 employees with a payroll of 1.3 million dollars per day during the school year. The school system has 1100 vehicles and logs more than 30,000 miles per day. They have

7.3 million square feet of buildings and 1700 acres of land. They serve 23,000 meals per day. In 2009, they gave out 15 million dollars in scholarships. That amount has increased to over 31 million dollars in 2018. In 2008, the on time graduation percentage was 55%. In 2018, that number rose to 80.7% with a lowered drop out rate of 2.3%. School safety is one of the top concerns in today's world. Safety measures have been put into place to help keep all of the Escambia County schools safe. Some of the measures that have been implemented include surveillance cameras, single entrance access, ID Badges for all staff and visitors, changing door locks, and even armed security. They have installed motion detectors that are activated after 10:00 PM. And by May of 2019, all schools will have full surveillance cameras in place.

Superintendent Thomas arranged a Skype room for kids to use to help them stay in touch with their parents who are currently away from home. The "Quarter Deck" has become very important to children whose parents are stationed overseas. The schools have also started live streaming all of the graduations for the parents that are unable to attend.

Malcolm was recognized this year as the Florida Superintendent of Schools and has announced that he will be retiring in 2020.

President Betty thanked the speaker and the volunteers and adjourned the meeting.
