#### WEEK IN REVIEW 3/21/2023

The March 13 meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was held at the Pensacola Bay Center. President Partington called the meeting to order at 12:00 and led approximately 56 members in the Four Way Test. Prayer and Pledge was delivered by Art Hufford.

Rotarian Ray Jones spread sunshine and WINE! He welcomed guests and recognized Rotarian Birthdays.

President Partington highlighted several important events on this day in history.

1556—Archbishop of Canterbury was executed. He was expected to give a scripted sermon on the day of his execution but he deviated from the script and was executed (as scheduled) soon thereafter.

1617— Pocahontas traveled to England with her husband, John Rolfe, to promote trade and good relations between the Indians and the English. Pocahontas fell ill while in England and died at the age of 21. Rolfe and Pocahontas had one son named Thomas.

1685—Famous composer, Johann Sebastian Bach, was born on March 21, 1685, in Germany.

1788—A devastating fire occurred in New Orleans, Louisiana, on March 21, 1788. In the aftermath of the disaster, the Spanish colonial government implemented new building codes and regulations to help prevent future fires. The disaster also led to the growth of the city's population and economy, as many people came to the area to help rebuild and take advantage of the opportunities created by the disaster.

1800—A coalition of European powers led by Austria defeated the French occupying forces and they withdrew from Rome. The city was returned to papal control, and Pope Pius VII was elected as the new pope.

Program chair Ed Wonders welcomed Terri Jenkins. She is the executive director of the American Red Cross of Northwest Florida. Originally from Florida, she recently moved back to West Florida in September 2022 to assume the role. Formerly a board member for the American Red Cross, Terri became and executive director in 2009. Her non-profit career of 24 years began at the Children's Advocacy Center in Valdosta, GA. She received a Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in Speech Communication

with an emphasis in public relations. Terri's civic involvement includes membership in the Valdosta Rotary Club for 9 years and last summer, ended her year as president. She is a proud mother to two, and grandmother to one granddaughter.

Terri's remarks centered around the American Red Cross. The American Red Cross is a non-profit organization and is supported by volunteers and its work is guided by the principles of humanity, impartiality, neutrality, independence, voluntary service, unity, and universality. It was founded in 1881 by Clara Barton, who was inspired by the work of the International Red Cross during the Franco-Prussian War. The American Red Cross Chapter in Pensacola, Florida provides services and support to the local community in times of emergency and disaster. The Pensacola Red Cross offers a range of services, including disaster response and recovery, blood drives, health and safety training, and services to military families. In the event of a disaster, such as a hurricane, flood, or fire, the Pensacola Red Cross provides shelter, food, and supplies to those affected. The organization also offers mental health services and support to help people cope with the emotional impact of disasters. The organization also provides training in CPR, first aid, and other life-saving skills.

In addition, the Pensacola Red Cross offers support to military families, including emergency financial assistance, counseling, and referrals to other resources. The organization also provides training to military personnel and their families on topics such as coping with deployment, parenting, and communication. Terri concluded her remarks with Q&A for the members, she provided gifts to those who responded.

President Bruce thanked our speaker, greeters, and ticket sales. He reminded members that the next meeting of the Rotary will be at the Pensacola Bay Center on March 28, at noon. He also reminded the members of the board meeting that followed the regular meeting of the members.

The meeting adjourned at 1:00pm.
