They host multiple athletic programs including baseball, soccer, basketball games, as well as summer camps and many other activities. The Parks and Recreation Department is also responsible for the Oseola Golf Course.

Upcoming events sponsored by the Parks and Recreation Department include the Pensacola food Truck Festival, Kids Fishing Clinic, the 35th Annual Pensacola Crawfish Festival, Pensacola Triathlon, Pitch Hit & Run competition, Easter Egg Hunt and a Senior Expo.
