

WEEK IN REVIEW 05/14/2019

It was a glorious, magnificent, ravishing, Chamber of Commerce day as Rotarians headed into lunch with reckless abandon for some fellowship and to hopefully learn a little bit from our program. Greeting today was the crack team of Jack Williams and Ed Wonders as many headed off to buy a raffle ticket.

President Betty brought the meeting to order and following the Prayer and Pledge by Ted Brown, she commenced with some announcements. First was to thank those who attended last week's Business in Ethics event on Monday and mentioned and congratulated the two winners – David Apple and Elizabeth McMalley. Pres. Betty went on to mention that there will be two installations next month - Innes Richards as District Governor and John Trawick as the new Club President. Welcome to the new leadership team of Innes and John.

A stack of 50/50 money went to lucky, and surprised, Pete Doyle. And Frank Beale had a quick Sunshine since we had a minimal guests although we did have a few birthday boys and girls. Then, we were off to the program.

Our program: Dr. Julie DeCeasar, OBGYN, was introduced by Dr. Jimmy Jones. She is a 21 year Scared Heart veteran who is soon off West Florida Hospital to begin a new initiative in obstetrics. The doctor's program today was on the subject of female mortality following child birth. The US is mortality rate is increasing while the

rest of the developed world's rate is declining. And in the US, Florida has one of the highest rates of all states. A few contributors to that high rate is the education level of the mother, poverty, obesity, and appropriate medical care following a birth and discharge from the labor and delivery ward. She also mentioned that the older you are the tougher it is on one's body and that complications can occur. Her next topic was a discussion on C-sections. One interesting fact is that the further south you go in the state the higher the rate of C-sections. Well over 50% of the births in Miami Dade County are C-sections - it is in the upper 30% range in NW Florida. Furthermore, initiatives to reduce the number of C-sections have had little success in Florida. California has had much better success in reducing the rate but that it also took two major State-wide roll outs in California to see noticeable results. USF in Tampa is leading the state-wide effort to spread the word about the dangers of C-sections and risks it brings to the mother and baby -- not to mention the financial negatives for society of having a high rate. She encouraged taking a look at the effects of the C-sections rate at the website propublica.com - although you may not agree with the websites politics, they certainly have some strong arguments about the dangers of a high C-section rate.
