### WEEK IN REVIEW 05/28/2019

The regular meeting of the Downtown Rotary was held at New World Landing on May 28th. Members were graciously greeted and welcomed at the door by Lisa York and Roger Vinson. Raffle tickets were sold by Matt Vinson and Larry Perino. The weather was wonderfully full of sunshine, but was a bit on the warm side. The meeting was called to order by President Betty who led us in the Four Way Test. After several announcements, she turned the podium over to Verdell Hawkins, who led in Prayer and Pledge. President Betty then took the podium to remind us about the upcoming installation of Innis Richards as our District Governor. The installation is being held at Pensacola Yacht Club on June 18th at 12 Noon and all are encouraged to attend. It will be a pleasure to be there as Innis assumes her new role in the Rotary Club. She also encouraged everyone o RSVP for the installation of the change of command. This event will also be held at the Pensacola Yacht Club on.

Alan Bookman provided us with Sunshine. He led off with the introduction of our visiting Rotarians and visitors. There were no military visitors today. He then read out the birthdays for this week and we all sang Happy Birthday.

Alan introduced our guest speakers, Laurie Rodgers and Christina Hawkins from the Pace Center for Girls. The Pace Center for girls is non-profit, non-residential organization who specializes in helping "At Risk" girls. Girls attend Pace to get appropriate counseling and education in a nurturing environment. Girls

attending the school must be between the ages of 11 & 17, enrolled in 6th to 11th grade and must present with 3 or more risk factors that are most likely to be present substance abuse by the girl or a family member, domestic violence, neglect, incarceration of a family member, foster home placement, low income, victim of sexual, physical or emotional abuse, low income. Approximately 124 girls attend Pace each year. The average age is 15. The Pace Center for Girls started in a small building behind University Mall in 1994. A year later they moved to a 4,000 square foot facility at Pensacola State College. They moved again in 2013 to their new location, which has more than 13,000 thousand square feet of space. Since opening in 1994, they have served more than 2,000 girls with academic, social services, and transition services. 65% of the Center's girls were filing one or more classes, 28% had prior arrests, and 15 had used drugs prior to entering this program. After leaving the school, 93% had no involvement with Juvenile Justice within one year of leaving Pace. 78% were in school or employed three years after leaving and 92% improved their academic performance. Pace Center for Girls was created in 1985 as an intervention program for at risk girls. The program has been a huge success and now has 33 Chapters in Florida and is currently planning to open one in Georgia. The center encourages anyone who wants to get involved to volunteer or make a donation.

President Betty thanked the volunteers and adjourned the meeting.
