Scott Sallis embraced "Sunshine," warmly recognizing our visiting Rotarians and guests. A special birthday shout-out and the traditional birthday song went to the one and only Tony Neuner – Happy Birthday, Tony! Before moving on to our program, President Allison engaged in a friendly flag exchange with a visiting Rotarian all the way from Peru, showcasing Rotary's international connections.

This Week's Program: A Historical Look at Pensacola's Fourth of July

Our program for the day was a captivating presentation by our esteemed Club member, Joe Vincent. Introduced by President Allison, Joe, a true Pensacolian and a renowned local historian celebrated for his numerous awards and accolades from various historical societies, took us on a fascinating journey through the history of Fourth of July celebrations right here in Pensacola.

Joe recounted the stories of several key figures in our city's past, including George Walton, George Walton Jr., General Galvez, and Dorothy Walton, who once called Romana Street home. These individuals laid the groundwork for Pensacola's inaugural Fourth of July celebration in **1822**, after Florida became a part of the United States. The day's activities included a reading of the Declaration of Independence and an intriguing shooting game called Patgo.

Other highlights from Pensacola's Fourth of July history that Joe shared included the visit of the USS Isla de Cuba warship in 1856, resulting in a vibrant exchange of fireworks between the ship and the shore. In the 1930s, these celebrations often coincided with the grand opening of a new City Park. Joe also touched upon how the Civil War and the suffering the South endured, complicated Fourth of July festivities for a period. However, the patriotic spirit was rekindled following World War I and II. leading to renewed and enthusiastic celebrations. He also made a brief mention of the Emma Jones Society, a historical precursor to the current LGBTQ Memorial Day celebration held annually at our beach. He had photo and discussed Johnson's Beach and the celebrations that occurred there over the years by the local African American citizen. More recent milestones highlighted were the 1976 Bicentennial celebration, the first Blue Angel Pensacola Beach Air Show in 1984, and the naming of the air show as "Red, White and Blues" in 1999. Looking ahead, Joe encouraged us to anticipate spectacular celebrations in 2026 for the United States' 250th anniversary.


