Mark Harden then introduced our guest speakers, Freddie Haydn-Slater and Lissa Dees, the Executive Director of the Downtown Improvement Board ("DIB"), who provided us information about the parking for downtown Pensacola. The DIB is a 44-block district. The DIB was created in 1972 to spur economic development, attract investment and reinvestment in downtown Pensacola, to beautify the district and preserve property values. The DIB is funded by a 2-mil tax paid by the District's property owners. There are several types of public parking available downtown through the DIB. The DIB parking is .the teal signs and is .50/ hour. You can download the PASSPORTParking cell phone go app on vour or to passportparking.com to pay for the parking or use

a pay station. You will need your tag number. 38% of downtown public parking is managed by the DIB. The rest of the downtown public parking is managed by private owners and organizations which set their own rules. The red signs are non-DIB public parking and is more expensive. The DIB reports that more than 30% of on street parking is free but has a 2-hour free limit which they report is enforced. Parking violations can be paid online, by phone, by mail or in person. You can appeal a parking citation within 15 days of the citation issue date. You can view more at www.downtownpensacola.com/parking. You can get a parking map with additional information at www.pensacolaparking.com. The DIB does not boot or tow. Non-DIB parking does boot and tow and is expensive.
