Fellowship began this sunny day in the parking lot as members arrived and entered whereupon they were greeted by Rotarians **Angela Hahn** and **Charles Gund.** Rotarians **Leslie Halsall** and **Hugh Hamilton** subsequently presented participants with an opportunity to win the progressive jackpot. Sustenance was then enjoyed by all pending the ringing of the magic bell.

President John Trawick called the meeting to order with the Four Way Test followed by Scott Sallis who led those present in prayer and the pledge. Following the introduction of our newest member, Bob Slater, John returned to the podium to share announcements with the group. Within those items was mention of the Seville Club's Emerald Coast Beer Festival occurring September 5 & 6 and our own Club's membership drive that continues to provide the first three lunches at no cost for prospective members. Rotarian Kaberi Samanta was called to the podium where she shared information about the upcoming Indian Musical Nite at UWF on September 7. John then proceeded to give away the progressive jackpot. However, the Joker was nowhere to be found. The day's winnings were \$9 resulting in the next jackpot amount starting at \$240.

Sunshine was delivered by Mayor **Grover Robinson** following John's announcements. After sharing a story about John and Grover's younger days that included building a snowman in Pensacola (a rare event indeed), Grover then introduced our visiting Rotarian and four guests, and also recognized birthdays along with the choral rendition of the happy birthday song. Following Grover, **Mark Harden** introduced the day's speaker **Cat Outzen** whose presentation was about the Studer Family Children's Hospital.

"The Studer Family Children's Hospital at Ascension Sacred Heart is Northwest Florida's only hospital solely dedicated to the care of sick and injured babies and children. The Children's Hospital provides quality, compassionate care to children, regardless of their parents' ability to pay. We offer a wide range of services to meet all of a child's medical needs, from the area's only Level III neonatal intensive care unit to pediatric intensive care, cancer care, rehabilitation and a medical staff of more than 120 board-certified doctors, caring for kids across 30 pediatric specialties." The hospital's new facility opened May 4th of this year with 75 patients on opening day. The date coincided with Star Wars Day, which was a fun tie-in to a popular movie series particularly among children. Historically, the hospital can trace its roots back to 1969 for its first building but it eventually spread out across the main hospital as its services grew. It is a regional facility with six outpatient centers across 19 Florida counties.

And, it has dogs! One currently and a second one coming in mid-August plus three more later. That will give the hospital five service dogs, four of which will have been provided from Impact 100 grants. Our Club has contributed to the Brain Bags initiative over the past few years that have been used in this hospital plus others.

President John concluded the meeting by thanking our speaker and the volunteers named above for their help in serving you to deliver another great meeting.
