Jack Brown introduced our newest member, **Charles Thornton**. A warm welcome to Charles. If you have not welcomed Charles, please do. Charles hit the ground running as an active member having brought with him a guest, Lawrence Powell. Way to go Charles.

President John reminded us that we are having a membership drive. Visitors can attend our meetings three times at no charge.

Art Hufford won \$10.00 in the raffle benefitting Rotary Foundation. The progressive pot is expected to climb to \$400 next week. The dream is still alive.

Sunshine was delivered by **Richard Sherrill**, who did a great job. He even managed get a good laugh out of our tough crowd. Richard recognized our two military guests, **Ensign O'Malley and Ensign Hackell**, both student Naval Flight Officers with VT-86. Richard introduced our four guests of Rotarians, who were welcomed to Rotary. Richard, accompanied by our top-notch harmonica player, **John Appleyard**, lead us in a rousing Happy Birthday to Ken Woolf, Jessica Lyublanovits and Matthew Massey. Happy Birthday Ken, Jessica and Matthew!

Andrea Krieger introduced our speaker, member **DeDe Flounlaker**, Executive Director of Manna Food Pantries. DeDe brought us up to date on the mission of Manna. We learned that Trinity Presbyterian Church had a role in the

creation of Manna. Manna has been serving our community for 35 years. DeDe recognized member, **Tom Owens** for his service on the Manna Board. Manna is funded 95% by local funding with only 3% of funding coming from grocery stores. Manna has 3 pantries, downtown Pensacola, Milton and Jay. It has 8 full time employees and 2 AmeriCorps Vista staff. Thus far this year, Manna has served over 15,000 people, 6,925 of whom were children and 4,217 of whom were seniors. The primary reasons given for need are: 1. disability, 2 unexpected expense and 3 loss of employment. Manna has gone outside the box and partnered with other agencies to increase the services to those in need. As DeDe stated: "Hunger is not the root cause". Manna's goal is to get to the root cause and assist people with the underlying needs that resulted in their need for food. Manna gets referrals from many sources, including the Department of Children & Families, Children's Home Society and the VA. There are over 120 places in Escambia and Santa Rosa Counties to get food. Manna is the largest of these. Manna is collaborating with others, including Westminster Village, Ministry Village and others. Manna has partnered with School Resource Officers in 26 schools this year to provide snacks for the children that meet with the officers. DeDe explained that Manna believes it is not about food, it is about relationships. During Hurricane Michael, Manna provided food to 35 family evacuees. Thus far this year Manna has been blessed to have 4.632 volunteers provide over 12,000 hours of service. Manna has an upcoming fundraiser, Pick a Bowl, which is September 6 from 6 to 8 pm at the Lou Ross Center of PSC. Tickets are \$40.00 and admission includes a one-of-a kind bowl, food and drinks. Thank you for speaking to us and thanks to those club members that helped DeDe during her talk providing flash statistics and information about Manna.

President John concluded the meeting by thanking our speaker along with greeters **Tammy Hardy Fauber and Will Hart**, and raffle ticket sellers, **Sherry Hartnett and Chris Kelly**, along with the other members mentioned above. **It was a great Rotary meeting**.
