where Rotary is now with the fight against this horrible disease. She shared the history of the first polio outbreak beginning in 1894 and how medical doctors worked hard to create vaccines to cure the disease. In 1979, Rotary International began its fight against polio.

In 2023, only three countries exist that have documented wild polio virus cases: Afghanistan (6), Pakistan (3) and Kenya (5). Also in 2023, \$1Billion has been committed by various organizations who will work with Rotary with \$500K being allocated to new funding of vaccines and \$500K for research and innovation.

In 2022, there was the 1st and only case of polio in the US in nearly a decade and that was in New York City where a male in his 20's was paralyzed but is not 100% clear that he still is.

Eradication Strategy: Goal 1: Permanently interrupt transmission of all polioviruses in Afghanistan and Pakistan. Goal 2: Stop transmission of circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus type 2 and prevent outbreaks in polio-free regions.

How can you help? Become a Polio Plus Member by donating \$100 annually to help rid the world of this disease.

President Beall expressed thanks to the Rotarians who did the prayer, pledge and ticket sales.
