

WEEK IN REVIEW 11/23/2021

The November 23 lunch meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola at the Pensacola Yacht Club (PYC) was called to order by President Wonders at 12:05 pm. Participants included 48 members on site at PYC and 6 online via Zoom.

Past President Fox introduced a new member, Betsy Smith. Betsy is a native of Coleman, Texas. She is a graduate of Texas University receiving her B.S. and received her MED and PHD from Texas A&M. Betsy is retired from Pensacola State College and is the owner of E.L. Smith Consulting.

President Wonders introduced a second new member Laura Campbell, who is a consultant and among the leaders of I-TEN Wired and IT Gulf Coast.

President Wonders' opening remarks reminded us that today is National Espresso Day, National Eat A Cranberry Day and National Cashew Day. He shed light on why we do not find cashews available in the shell.

Regarding the Rotary jackpot, the joker remains at-large. Additionally, President Wonders raffled several tasty items! All are grateful for his scrumptious donations to the ticket raffle.

Rotarian Kelsey Powell presented sunshine. His humor centered on religious philanthropy and wedded bliss. He welcomed 2 visiting Rotarians (including one from Uganda) and 2 guests. Birthday greetings for 3 Rotarians were announced followed by a chorus of Happy Birthday You All:

Program Chair Joe Vinson welcomed Mike Bunn who currently serves as Director of Historic Blakeley State Park in Spanish Fort, Alabama. Previously, he directed the Historic Chattahoochee Commission (a bi-state agency operating in southeastern Alabama and southwestern Georgia) and worked as a curator with the Columbus (Georgia) Museum and the Mississippi Department of Archives and History's Museum of Mississippi. He has also worked with the Birmingham Historical Society and the Tuscaloosa County Preservation Society. Mike obtained his undergraduate degree from Faulkner University and earned master's degrees in history and higher education administration from the University of Alabama. He also completed a graduate certificate in public history at the University of West Georgia. Bunn is author or co-author of several books on Gulf South history focusing on the colonial, early statehood, antebellum, and Civil War periods. Mike is editor of Muscogiana, the journal of the Muscogee County (Georgia) Genealogical Society, and chair of the Baldwin County Historic Development Commission. He frequently teaches regional history courses with local continuing education programs and serves as a lecturer with the Alabama Humanities Foundation bicentennial scholars program. Mike and his wife Tonya live in Daphne, Alabama with their daughter Zoey.

Bunn's remarks covered key factors in the Creek War and points of intersection with the War of 1812. The author provided fascinating information on the percentage of all Creeks who adopted American culture and farming practices. Approximately half of all Creek's accepted the new ways of the Americans. He touched on the Federal Road, which is modern-day I-65 between Mobile and Montgomery. Bunn noted that Creek Indians came to Pensacola to purchase ammunition and guns. Americans recognized this as a potential threat and ambushed them. The Creek retaliated and massacred many in a subsequent battle. The conflict culminated in the Battle of Horseshoe Bend, which saw the rise of Andrew Jackson. The battle claimed the largest number of casualties among native Americans. The talk ended with an insightful Q&A.

In closing remarks, President Wonders thanked today's speaker, the greeters, and ticket sales. He announced that next week's speaker is the leader of the Downtown Improvement Board."

President Wonders adjourned the meeting at 1:05 pm.
