WEEK IN REVIEW 12/6/2022

The December 6, 2022 meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was called to order at 12:08. It was held at the Pensacola Bay Center due to unavailability at the Yacht Club. Past president Ed Wonders led the Four-Way Test. Rotarian Leslie Mickles led the prayer and pledge.

Ed gave the week's announcements. The Rotary International Convention will take place May 27-31 in Melbourne, Australia. RLI training information is available on the DacDB website. Annual pledge forms are on the tables. We are still offering potential members three meals for free. Rotarian Brian Wyer received a Founding Member award at CivicCon. Our club will sponsor five RYLA students, please consider any sophomores who might be interested in participating. Today is National Pawnbrokers Day, Mitten Tree Day, and Microwave Day, and Ed gave a history of those commemorations. Scott Sallis had the winning the 50-50 raffle ticket and drew a 5 from the deck.

Dale Jordan presented Sunshine. Henry Roberts brought three guests from Brightbridge. Chris Kelly's son Asher is another guest. Dale recounted two humorous stories from Shaquille O'Neal, and relayed predictions from a CIA speaker about the state of the economy and the possibility of conflict over Taiwan. The week's birthdays are Jane White and Brian Wyer.

Rotarian Henry Roberts introduced the speaker from Bright Bridge Ministries, Pastor Robin Nobles, executive director and United Methodist minister. Bright Bridge is a last-minute replacement as the planned speaker canceled. Their role is to "help individuals along the way" with rehabilitation programs for people struggling with addiction. It is a Christian ministry that operates out of the old Richards Memorial United Methodist Church, with an annual budget ranging between \$500k-\$1 million. Robin said they reopened their men's shelter in July and have served 115 homeless individuals, finding jobs for 57 of them. Their requirements include being drug- and alcohol-free and willing to work. They also have a food ministry that has served over 5,000 meals in November alone. No requirements to receive a hot meal. Another 5,000 hot meals have been prepared for shelters, including women and children's shelters they do not operate themselves. A Bright Bridge video was played. Robin introduced a staff member, James Donelson, who oversees the shelter and transitional housing, and who is approaching 9 years sober. Resident David Lineham also spoke about his experience struggling with addiction and mental disorders. After an incident of selfharm he contacted Bright Bridge, and he's now an overnight manager and 6 months sober. Henry thanked the Rotarians for all the support the club has given. A guestion about how to find transitional housing. Robin said it's in their building; they operate out of a Brownsville church and converted old Sunday School classrooms into bedrooms, and once residents get a job the program fee is \$100/week. They are at capacity with 42 residents, including some off-site. Henry said they also own a residence near Cordova Park that was donated, with six men living there. A new renovation in progress (by Rotarian Scott Sallis) will double the church's capacity. James drives residents to job interviews and helps them fill out applications online. The goal is for residents to reach independence. Robin said they've also facilitated food service skill training for residents to be eligible for good-paying jobs in restaurant kitchens. According to Henry, "There's always hope. There are people on the streets who need to hear that, and you've helped us do that."
