WEEK IN REVIEW 2/16/2021

With Mardi Gras 2021 being curtailed, there was no better place to be than the February 16th meeting of the Pensacola Rotary Club. Complete with a history of the origin of Mardi Gras, President Sally welcomed a Zoomful of roughly 55 Rotarians to the virtual gathering. After she reminded us of our Club's 2021 focus on REEFS, President Sally gave a shout out to Rotarian Lisa Minchew, Rotarian Vicki Campbell and Executive Secretary Chris Bridwell for their work in putting together the highly successful Wine & Tapas event at the Pensacola Country Club. Door prizes were awarded. Money was raised for the Rotary Foundation. Contribution was made to the Manna Food Bank. A good time was had by all.

After Rotarian Lori NeSmith led the prayer and pledge, Rotarian Margaret Stopp introduced Dr. Marcus McBride, Chief Executive Officer of CareerSource ESCAROSA. CareerSource ESCAROSA is a 501 (c) 3 and is a collaborative effort to serve the workforce related needs of the community. The goal is to move the needle to improve lives of those in the community.

Dr. McBride describes CareerSource ESCAROSA as the Match.com of the workforce, matching job seekers with appropriate companies. Being one of twenty-four members of the statewide workforce development board affords CareerSource ESCAROSA the necessary resources to help both employees and employers find each other. The funding for the twenty-four workforce development boards comes through the State of Florida's Department of Economic Opportunity.

EMPLOY Florida is another resource that is utilized to help employers find employees. The statewide platform allows for job postings at no cost.

COVID-19 has caused visits to CareerSource ESCAROSA offices (Century, Milton and Pensacola) to now be scheduled by appointments. For the most recent fiscal year completed on June 30, 2020, the locations had 14,571 one stop visits; 4,841 referrals to jobs; and 320 re-employment services.

Programs offered through CareerSource ESCAROSA include Business Services, Veterans Resources, Military Family Employee Assistance Program, Workforce Innovation Opportunity, Welfare Transition Program and Basic Career Services.

After describing each of these programs, descriptions of which can be found at careersourceescarosa.com, Dr. McBride answered a few questions from the audience. In one of his replies, he described

how CAREERSOURCE Escarosa serves the community through a collaboration with its economic partners, two of which include Achieve Escambia and Florida West.

In an effort to continue to reach out to both employers and employees during COVID-19, virtual job fairs have been held. Unfortunately, not everyone always has access to technology and missing the in-person element is hard to overcome.

Dr. McBride is hopeful that there will be a smart phased-in approach to the move to \$15 an hour minimum wage. This approach would be one that includes consideration for both the employer and employee. Businesses cannot employee individuals if their doors are closed.

In closing, Dr. McBride reminded the Rotarians in attendance that CareerSource Escarosa is also available to help with career transitions.

Rotarian Joe Vinson next provided the meeting with what can simply be described as a hilariously delightful round of Mardi Gras themed Sunshine. While the material was solid, Rotarian Joe's delivery was impeccable!

New Rotarian Kelsey Powell was introduced by Rotarian Leslie Mickles. Rotarian Kelsey is a Pensacola native, a graduate of UWF earning a B.A. in Journalism and an M.Ed. in Curriculum and Instruction. He is employed as the Community Liaison with the City of Pensacola. Kelsey is a member of the National Education Association, American Federation of Teachers, and Escambia Educators Association. He also is the engagement and volunteerism chair with United Way and a Board Member with the Boys and Girls Club of the Emerald Coast. He is married to Stephanie and has two children.

Sorna Knight provided the Club with an update concerning the recent \$1000 contribution to the Boys & Girls Club garden project located at H & Leonard Streets.

After a reminder concerning the District Conference and Grant Application process, the meeting was adjourned by President Sally.
