WEEK IN REVIEW

The regular meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was held under steamy summer skies on June 7, 2015, President Andrea called her first meeting to order and led the group in the Four Way Test. Dale Jordan was called to the podium for a prayer and the pledge to our flag. President Andrea announced the upcoming ribbon cutting of the Centennial Playground at the Community Maritime Park. She also relayed a message from Kenny Morgan announcing that Lynn Paul would be hosting an open house to celebrate the 60th anniversary of his company, Specialty Contractors, and all club members are invited. Andrea also recognized Vince Currie for a recent pronouncement by the Episcopal Diocese for his years of dedicated service. The raffle pot of \$45 was carted off by Dale Jordan always some suspicion in the room when a person on the dais takes home the loot and there were several razzies issued around the room as the funds were handed to Dale. Several Blue Wahoo's tickets were also doled out to lucky ticketholders.

Hugh Hamilton was then called to the podium for Sunshine. Hugh introduced one guest of a Rotarian and two visiting Rotarians. Hugh then jumped into a rather lengthy joke centered around political cows from various party affiliations and countries around the world. Just when you thought he was going to deliver the punchline he would continue with the joke. A fairly rousing applause when the joke was over, but that most likely from joy of the ending of the exercise. Hugh then jumped in to a woman joke that was somewhat briefer yet applause for brevity. Hugh then stepped into the dangerous waters of delivering a third joke during which President Andrea was seen gathering her hook from underneath the dais. Hugh then announced the birthday boys and girls and with harmonic accompaniment led the group in a rousing rendition of Happy Birthday You All.

Andrea then introduced Innes Richards, the Assistant Governor for our district and former President of our club and many other Rotary distinctions earned since joining our club in 1998. Innes then introduced our program, District Governor Leon Hirsh. Leon was born in Cincinatti and naturally is a big Reds fan. He obtained a degree in Psychology from Transylvania University and later pursued a successful career as a financial advisor/ planner. He recently opened the Pensacola office of the Benjamin Edwards firm. He is the 102nd District Governor of District 6940. Leon reminded us of this year's Rotary motto – be a gift to the world.

Leon then took us back in time to a Cincinnatti of the 50's and 60's where many large national companies were headquartered and GE operated a major aircraft engine manufacturing plant. Cincy was also home to many national, regional and local beer brewers as well as national liquor distillers. The city

enjoyed significant riverboat commerce, a thriving arts community and a world class zoo. Also in the 50's a young doctor named Albert Sapin was recruited to head up a new pediatric hospital in Cincinatti. In his research he theorized that an oral vaccine for polio was likely to be successful after developing successful vaccines while in the Army. In 1954 Sabin performed his first clinical trial. At about the same time Jonas Salk was working on his vaccine and it was first to be accepted by the US Government. Sabin's vaccine was less invasive than the Salk vaccine. Sapin later collaborated with a group of Russian physicians to create a large quantity of his vaccine which was used to eradicate polio in several countries. Leon then vividly recounted the hysteria that was enveloping the United States regarding fear of polio in children and parents with visions of iron lungs and paralysis. Thanks to the involvement of many committed physicians and a huge commitment from Rotary International polio has been eradicated in all but four countries.

Andrea then thanked our speaker for an extremely informative program which vividly portrayed the key players in the battle to eradicate polio. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
