

DeeDee asked him what he loved about Pensacola and his answer was, "The Promise," we treaded water for a while but he is excited about the way things are evolving and it will be a good future for our children. We will definitely miss Dan Shugart if he retires next year!

President Kieger thanked all who attended today's meeting, recognized our birthday honorees for a total of 117 combined years in Rotary and adjourned the meeting.
