WEEK IN REVIEW

The weekly meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was held at New World Landing on the last day of summer, Tuesday, September 22, 2015. Britt Landrum welcomed members and guests at the door. Carol Law and Bob Larkin did a great job of ticket sales. President Andrea Krieger called the meeting to order and led us in the Four Way Test. Ed Meadow was the lucky winner of the \$55 jackpot and may have actually drawn his own ticket.

Connie Bookman, President of Pathways to Change, thanked the club for the Grant awarded to the Organization to assist in their efforts with the new not for profit endeavor – Everything Outdoors, a business designed to offer on the job training and certifications in landscaping. There was a buzz of excitement and activity in the air as there were special guests in the audience from Big Brothers and Big Sisters and Sheila Bowman from Representative Miller's office. Soon it was revealed that one of our own was being honored for his service and commitment to his "little" over the past years. Doug Werber was recognized as the Big Brother of the Year for Santa Rosa County by the organization and received a letter of commendation from Rep. Jeff Miller for his dedication and faithful mentoring to a young man in need. Doug received a well deserved standing ovation and congratulations from the club.

The well designed program continued with the theme of social responsibility as Ed Meadows introduced Mr. Stephen Black, Director of the Center for Ethics & Social Responsibility at the University of Alabama. Stephen Black, grandson of U.S. Supreme Court Justice Hugo L. Black, grew up in New Mexico after most of his family left the state in the 1950's and 60's following his grandfather's role in controversial Civil Rights decisions, including Brown v. Board of Education. Despite growing up over 1,000 miles away, from a very young age, he was fascinated by Alabama and the legacy of his family's commitment to public service in their home state. Mr. Black gave an impassioned talk regarding the data suggesting a downturn in

current times in the commitment to joining and supporting organizations whose mission is to give back to society. He has taken his mission of encouraging students to learn, serve and pass on to others the desire to give back and to recognize the needs of others to the University of Alabama Center for Ethics & Social Responsibility. Mr. Black founded Impact Alabama, an award-winning nonprofit with a staff of 51 full-time college graduates who have provided more than 6,300 college students and 150 recent graduates the opportunity to participate in structured service projects designed to promote learning and leadership development. Mr. Black and his organization are spreading good works and ideas to Pensacola State College and United Way of Escambia County. After thanking all who served President Andrea adjourned the meeting.
