WEEK IN REVIEW

De Flounlacker introduced the program speaker, Detective Jeff Brown, Pensacola Police Department. Det. Brown is also a sworn deputy with the Escambia County and Santa Rosa County Sheriff's offices. He works in the Cyber Crime Division and Cyber Security areas of the PPD and is a certified

crisis negotiator. Det. Brown delivered a very informative talk about Cyber Security for Businesses. Cyber Security for your home and Cyber Security for your children. Some facts about cyber crime are that the United States is the 3rd most hacked nation in the world. Most cyber crimes do not involve the misappropriation of funds. Most cyber crimes involve the theft of personal information in order to sell that information to others who would commit crimes using the false identities and information obtained as a result of the hacking. Personal information regarding customers or employees can and should be protected by using complicated passwords and vigilance with regard to the use of wireless applications and Wi-Fi internet access. Home personal information can also be protected with the use of complicated passwords that change frequently. Detective Brown suggests the following be strongly considered for homes and businesses and parents to help quard against cyber crimes and hacking. Use complicated passwords, have two accounts for the internet access – one for personal or

customer information and one for guests communications. To eliminate hacking activities overnight or when the computer is not in use un-plug the router instead of just shutting down the computer. Be wary of spam or any unusual e-mails with attachments. Purchase and update anti-virus software. Det. Brown advises parents to watch out for cell phones, gaming devices and other digital access by children. Know their passwords and check their activity regularly. Be wary of cell phone applications where children are concerned. SNAPCHAT and other similar applications should be avoided. According to Det. Brown Smart phones with all their enhancements can be just as dangerous as guns when they are mishandled.
