WEEK IN REVIEW

The regular meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was held on March 29 under clear spring skies at New World Landing in beautiful Downtown Pensacola.

Rotarians and their guests were greeted warmly by Jack Williams while Ed Wonders hawked raffle tickets under the watchful eye of Tom Kane.

President-Elect Bruce Baumgardner called the meeting to order and led the group in the Four Way Test. Bruce was filling in for President Andrea who was out of town on United Way business. Bruce called Roger Vinson to the podium to lead the group in prayer and the pledge to the flag. Robert Mills then carted off the loot in the raffle pot to various groans of disappointment around the room. Better luck next time! Bruce then called Frank Beall to the podium for Sunshine. Frank introduced 2 quests of Rotarians and 3 visiting Rotarians. The group then rallied to wish Happy Birthday You All to the 3 birthday boys and girls who were all in attendance - don't know that I have ever seen this happen. Dee Dee Flounlacker was then called to the podium to introduce our program. Hats off to Dee Dee for handling the introduction of Gulf Power VP

of Customer Sales and Service, Bentina Terry with great aplomb. Dee Dee was challenged by Bentina's 4 page bio yet she artfully chose the most salient points to welcome this well known business and civic leader. Bentina informed the group that Gulf Power has a very active solar energy effort in addition to it's coal based and natural gas driven power generation. In the past the coal based generation provided up to 75% of generated power and that number now stands at appx 30 -40%. Bentina also discussed Gulf's renewable energy efforts at the Perdido Landfill in conjunction with the landfill's owner, Escambia County. The facility at the landfill consists of a gas turbine that is driven by methane emanating from the buried refuse. There is currently I unit in place at the landfill. Bentina also discussed efforts in the area of wind energy which is sourced from Oklahoma as its climate is more conducive to production than our climate.

On the solar front, the biggest obstacle heretofore has been cost of production due primarily to the sizeable tracts of land required to build a solar facility. Gulf Power has partnered with the military who owns

plenty of land that they can contribute to the effort as they are anxious to create their own power for national security purposes. There are currently 3 solar facilities in the Northwest Florida area. The facility located on Eglin property contains 362,000 solar panels and can produce up to 50 megawatts of electric power. Bentina discussed a new program from Gulf Power called the Community Solar Program. Terms call for a 5 year subscription at a monthly rate of \$89 and the opportunity to receive monthly credits on your bill for participation in the program. Thank you Dee Dee for a very informative program. Hats off to Brian for running a very smooth and efficient meeting – clearly leadership of the Club will be in good hands when he assumes the President's role at the change of command this summer.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
