The weekly meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was held at New World Landing on a rainy summer day, Tuesday, July 26, 2016, 2016. President Brian Baumgardner called the meeting to order and led us in the four way test. Mark Harden did a great job with ticket sales and a Military guest was the lucky winner. Cal Moore inspired us with his prayer and led us in the pledge of allegiance. Scott Grissett provided Sunshine and welcomed two Military guests, guests of members and visiting Rotarians. John Phelps was honored with the birthday greeting and a nod to his 52 years of membership.

De Flounlacker introduced Mike Ensley, Staff writer for the Center for Research and Economic Development for the University of West Florida. Mr. Ensley has spent 20 years working as a journalist, graphic artist and social media director. He has worked for the Pensacola News Journal, Pensacola Today, The Studer Community Institute and Pensacola State College. When not working, Mike is an avid reader of comic books. a

film fanatic, music aficionado and lover of pop culture which led him to found and chair the Pensacon convention.

Mike was here to speak to the Club about Pensacon, a weekend long event held in downtown Pensacola in February described as "an all inclusive Pop Culture Convention that welcomes characters from every Galaxy". The next Pensacon weekend is scheduled for February 17-19, 2017. The weekend convention consists of a lineup of events that include a meet and greet with Pop celebrities from movies and TV series, Star Wars and Star Trek among them, Costume Contest, Musical performances and a market place for exhibits and merchandising of all types of pop memorabilia. The base of operations for the Convention is the Bay Center and downtown Pensacola venues. The third annual event was held in February, 2016 and brought in 22, 500 attendees and had an economic impact of \$3.057.457 and the total economic impact for the three conventions is registered at \$8,264,981. Some demographics determined by a survey for Visit Pensacola

are the average age of the attendees is 35 and the average household income of the attendees is \$55,101; 21% of the attendees are from the local area, 91% of the visitors from outside of the area are repeat visitors and 100% of the visitors would return to Pensacon . The mission statement for Pensacon is "To create the best multi-genre convention that is unique to the Pensacola community and that is a safe and welcoming environment for all types of fans." The promoters of Pensacon are dedicated to helping the community by continuing to bring in visitors during the shoulder season of February and by supporting and partnering with the non-profit charitable organizations of Manna Food Pantry, The Children's Home Society, One Blood, Pensacola MESS Hall and South Park.
