Flounlacker, was introduced by Leslie Hunter-Huff. DeDe did an exceptional iob giving us information on one of our favorite charities, The Manna Foodbank. Like many of businesses and homes, the Manna Foodbank offices and warehouses were flooded during that terrible storm in April of 2014. Fortunately, DeDe and her many workers and volunteers were able to reopen after only one business day. Major damage was sustained to the building and all of the inventory was lost. DeDe, coworkers and many volunteers worked hard to re-open using temporary space. They have been searching for the perfect location to relocate, since the current building could not be mitigated to avoid future flood issues. They have been successful in finding the right place and hope to begin renovations on their new site. It is located at 3030 North E Street and has about 23,000 square feet.

They have also reformatted the way they offer assistance. Previously, they partnered with two other organizations and now have partnered with a total of eight to offer, not only food

services, but additional services that are frequently needed.

The average income of a senior living in Westminster Apartments is less than \$1,000.00 per month and they require as much assistance as possible, just to get by. 21 children per day are helped and 14% of those helped are active duty members. Only 6% of those seeking assistance are actually homeless.

Due to regulations regarding the distribution of USDA Commodities, Manna is no longer getting food from this source. Instead they depend on contributions. DeDe finished her presentation by introducing John Hutchinson, who is the chair person responsible for helping raise the funds needed to renovate the new facility. He explained about some of the naming opportunities available for those considering donating to this very worthwhile cause.

The meeting was adjourned by Innes Richards.
