WEEK IN REVIEW 1/28/2025

President Roberts called the meeting to order at 12:15 p.m. Rotarian Frank Beall led the members in prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Guest Speaker and Announcements

DeDe Flounlacker, Executive Director of Manna Food Bank, addressed the members, expressing gratitude for their continued support. She noted a significant decline in food donations compared to the previous year and highlighted upcoming fundraisers as an opportunity to offset the shortfall. President Roberts welcomed a new member and presented Asher Kelley with a Paul Harris Fellow recognition.

Rotarian Ted Brown delivered "Sunshine" presenting it in a five-pound bag of potatoes.

Guest Speaker: Howard Reddy, UWF Vice President of Advancement

Rotarian Sherry Hartnett introduced Howard Reddy, who oversees the UWF Foundation's endowment investments, which now exceed \$140 million. As the university's chief philanthropic officer, he plays a key role in fundraising efforts. Reddy acknowledged the presence of former and current faculty, staff, UWF alumni, and friends. He expressed appreciation for the longstanding generosity of the Rotary Club of Pensacola and highlighted the university's scholarship programs. Attendees received a summary detailing the number of scholarships awarded, their criteria, and their impact. A scholarship spotlight at each table featured students who had benefited from these awards. He thanked the Rotary Club of Pensacola for contributing to the 123 scholarships awarded this semester, emphasizing the life-changing impact on recipients.

Reddy provided an update on UWF Advancement, particularly the university's ambitious capital campaign. In April 2024, UWF publicly announced a campaign goal of \$90 million, with a completion target of June 30, 2026. With 17 months remaining, the campaign focuses on sustaining UWF's mission by investing in faculty, students, research, and infrastructure.

Key fundraising efforts include:

Scholarships and Faculty Support – The campaign has established 114 new scholarship funds, both endowed and non-endowed, to ensure all undergraduate students have access to financial support. Even

modest scholarships, such as \$500 awards, can make a substantial difference. Additional funding is sought for new programs, such as the civil engineering degree.

Major Gifts –The Bear family donated over \$2.5 million to support scholarships in the College of Business. Jerry and Rhonda Maygarden committed \$250,000 to the Maygarden Family Scholarship for undergraduate communication students. The Wright Family Institute for Global and Population Health, housed within the College of Health, established a new public health research institute through a significant contribution from alumni Steven and Mona Wright. A new civil engineering department is planned, with fundraising efforts continuing.

Infrastructure and Facilities Enhancements — Rotarian Ted Brown contributed to facility and equipment improvements at UWF's Port of Pensacola location, known as the Watercraft and Vessel Engineering (WAVE) program. At the campaign's public launch, Gordon and Debbie Gordon pledged more than \$9 million to fund the construction of a new stadium. Diane Miller donated funds in honor of her late husband, a former UWF computer science faculty member. Her \$97,000 contribution funded a much-needed data server for the department. The Barbara Goggins Train Pavilion was made possible by the generosity of the Lake Goggins McMillen family. Reddy also recognized Rotarian Chris Kelly for his pivotal role in securing an important property in East Pensacola Heights related to the DeLuna Settlement. Margaret and Harry Stopp donated to enhance the Historic Village, an ongoing restoration project. The Pensacola Museum of Art received funding to improve its Main Street entrance, with further support anticipated.

Since January 2022, UWF has experienced tremendous philanthropic support. Reddy expressed heartfelt appreciation to the Rotary members and broader community for their contributions. The meeting concluded with remarks from students who shared how these scholarships and donations have positively impacted their academic journeys.

President Roberts thanked Dr. Reddy for his presentation and acknowledged UWF's past and present leadership, including Drs Judy Bense and Martha Saunders.

The meeting adjourned at 12:55 p.m.
