Olivia McNally, new Programs Chair introduced Big Brothers and Big Sisters Executive Director Paula Shell.

Paula has held the title of executive director for 27 years and herself has mentored three "littles" as the children are called.

MISSION: Create and support one-to-one mentoring relationships that ignite the power and promise of youth.

VISION: All youth achieve their full potential.

Paula shared information about their Beyond School Walls program, which is aimed at helping students improve their chances of graduating and transitioning to the workplace and/or

post-secondary education. You can open up the doors of hope and opportunity for students by allowing them to shadow volunteer employee mentors in the workplace for just a few hours each month during the school year.

- Students are matched with volunteer mentor employees.
- For a minimum of two school years (junior and senior years), students shadow their mentors in the workplace once a month for four hours.
- During each visit, workplace partners conduct a brief workshop on a selected skill of the month for the students.
- Workplace partners provide breakfast and lunch to students.

There is a great need for volunteers, mentors, donors and friends to help children who are in the program and there are 185 children on the waiting list.

A goal for the organization is to increase the number of children in the program to 1000 by 2030. In Florida, BBBS, is one of 11 agencies to receive financial assistance from the Escambia County Children's Trust Fund. If anyone is interested in learning more, please reach out to Paula.
