Program Chair Olevia McNally introduced the program: Marty Stanovich of First Tee

Here are some highlights:

- First Tee was organized in 2003.
- Marty Stanovich is the President and CEO.
- Total of 8 charters.
- First Tee Gulf Coast is a youth-serving organization that teaches golf as a life-long sport to instill character education through the game's inherent "Nine Core Values."
- Since the founding of its Local Chapter in 2003, First Tee has worked to spread character education and junior golf to the counties (Bay, Escambia, Okaloosa, Santa Rosa, and Walton) of the Florida Panhandle through 102 National School Programs in area (K-5) schools and 15 Golf Course program sites.
- The goal of First Tee is to teach life skills to kids aged 9-15. Also teaches them to love the game of golf.

- Two goals: create (1) good citizens and (2) golfers for life.
- Opportunities for First Tee kids to compete in "participant opportunities."
- Women's golf is the single most underserved college scholarship. If you know of a girl who may be interested in learning the sport at an early age, there is a high likelihood of obtaining a college scholarship.
- First Tee raises good kids into great adults.
 - It all starts with values. First Tee's Nine Core Values are: honesty, integrity, sportsmanship, respect, confidence, responsibility, perseverance, courtesy and judgment.
- First Tee teaches kids to have honesty and integrity about the rules of the game.
- It teaches good sportsmanship--respect teammates and competitors.
- First Tee teaches three types of respect: for competitors, for the golf course, for ourselves.
- First Tee tracks the kids to see how they are succeeding throughout the program and after the program.
- It teaches kids confidence--looking people in the eye when you speak to them, shaking hands, etc.
- It teaches them to show up on time, take care of the golf course, and to take care of each other.
- It teaches kids courtesy and judgment.
- There is a seven-step process to become a First Tee coach. You do not have to be a great golfer to be a great teacher.
- In terms of donation needs, they need kids clubs, ladies clubs, left-handed clubs, and ladies gently worn apparel.

President Roberts adjourned the meeting at 12:57 p.m.
