WEEK IN REVIEW 09/09/2025

President Allison Hill welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 12:05. Jack Williams led the meeting with prayer and pledge.

Announcements:

- 1) Gary Dennis was welcomed as a new member by Jane. Gary is a 30-year Rotarian but new to our club. Welcome, Gary!
- 2) Betty Roberts welcomed visiting Rotarian Sandra Smith of the Asheville Rotary Club; Sandra was a member of the Pensacola Club for 16 years before moving. She presented a flag from the Asheville Club and shared that the club raised \$500K for the Helene Operation.

Committee Reports:

- 1) Andrea Kreiger presented a membership report: There are 16 growing clubs and 25 declining clubs in the district. In our club, there are 158 members with six new members and four who departed. Our club consists of 67% male and 33% female. Years of Service: 0-1=30, 2-3=13, 4-5=13, 6-10=16, 11-15=7, 16-20=21, 21-25=20 and 26 and higher = 35 members. Our membership goal is 166 members by next summer, so Andrea encouraged everyone to think about our networks and invite community members to Rotary in the hopes of adding to our membership.
- 2) Mike shared upcoming opportunities as Service Projects and stated he would like to see between 1-3 projects take place monthly. 1) Naturalization Ceremony which will take place September 25th and in November; 2) UWF Argo Food Pantrybring items in (food and toiletries) to support the pantry in October. Mike shared that 10% of students suffer food poverty. 3) Ready Kids, a program where mentors read on a weekly basis to children from PreK through third grade. 50% of children

are not ready for kindergarten in Escambia County. There will be a booth at the Seafood Festival for people to sign up.

Sunshine Report: Ed Wonders joked about the college football games in his opening and that fans called the UW Hotline, and shared memorable events of September 9 (Boxed Wine Day, and others).

Guests in Attendance: Jim Ashowp? from Seattle who just moved to Pensacola, Charles Culpepper guest of Bill Fleming and Mark Isbell, guest of Bob Rogers.

Birthdays for this week: Greg Stonehouse (12), Charles Kahn, Jr. (14), and Howard Reddy (14) Happy Birthday to everyone! Harland "Colonel Sanders," Otis Redding, Adam Sandler also shared this birthday.

Guest Speaker: Escambia County School Superintendent Keith Leonard shared a "report card" of sorts of system's status: 11 schools improved this past year and 85% stayed the same. Grades 16 A's, 15 B's and 17 C's and two below average. He shared how the staff is working hard to improve scores, but some high schools were their highest in 18 years. There is a 96% stability rate with employees, which is good. Also recognized but in review of is that 48% of children are not prepared for kindergarten.

President Hill thanked greeters Trey Manderson and Ron Martin and Dale Knee and Mark Hardent (ticket sales) for their service today.


