WEEK IN REVIEW 09/23/2025

President Hill called the meeting to order and led the membership in reciting the Four-Way Test. Rotarian Ted Brown offered the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

President Hill then presented Jean Norman with a six-plus Paul Harris pin. Following the presentation, Jean drew an ace to win \$10 from the raffle. President Allison announced that next week's meeting will be relocated to the Eaddy Morris Activity Center at Lifeview.

Charles Beall delivered the sunshine report, introducing visitors and recognizing birthdays. Rotarian Julie Parker Tippins introduced the speaker, Tom Selinger, from American Diplomacy (formerly U.S. Diplomacy), who gave a presentation on the history of American diplomacy.

Mr. Selinger is a twenty-five-year veteran of the Foreign Service, most recently serving as director of the Office for European and Eurasian Affairs in the Bureau for Democracy, Human Rights, and Labor. In coordination with European governments, he and his team addressed challenges such as human rights abuses and democratic backsliding. His most recent overseas posting was as chief of the Political and Economic Section at the U.S. Embassy in Kyrgyzstan, where he led efforts to normalize bilateral relations with Central Asia's fragile democracy.

Other overseas assignments included tours in Denmark, Croatia, Albania, and Trinidad and Tobago, where he worked on issues ranging from Arctic policy and security cooperation to NATO integration and war crimes prosecutions. In Washington, he served as senior advisor at the Center for the Study of the Conduct of Diplomacy at the Foreign Service Institute, desk officer for Norway and Sweden,

and Rusk Fellow at Georgetown University's Institute for the Study of Diplomacy. Prior to joining the Foreign Service, Mr. Selinger served as an intelligence officer in the U.S. Army and as a political officer at the Canadian Consulate General in Minnesota. He speaks French, German, Croatian, Danish, and Russian with varying levels of proficiency and holds a B.A. in Journalism from Drake University. He and his wife, fellow Foreign Service officer Kirsten Selinger, have four children.

Selinger's presentation traced the evolution of U.S. foreign policy from Thomas Jefferson's early focus on commercial and maritime interests to the professionalization of the Foreign Service under the Rogers Act of 1924. He highlighted the diverse roles played by American diplomats, from evacuation operations during the Balkan conflicts of the 1990s to implementing the Marshall Plan after World War II. He emphasized that diplomats not only manage crises abroad but also advance long-term American prosperity through trade, security cooperation, and international agreements.

The program concluded with a discussion of the challenges diplomats face, including personal risks in conflict zones and the shifting priorities brought by changes in

presidential administrations. Selinger also explored the intersections of diplomacy and domestic politics, particularly debates over healthcare, government funding, and the broader alignment of foreign and domestic policy.
