WEEK IN REVIEW 11/19/2024

The November 19 meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was held at the Pensacola Yacht Club. President Roberts called the meeting to order at 12:10 PM and welcomed approximately 80 members and 4 guests, including the guest speaker, Dr. Jaromy Kuhl, Provost of the University of West Florida (UWF).

Rotarian Art Hufford delivered a thoughtful prayer and led the Pledge of Allegiance. President Roberts then guided the group through the Four-Way Test.

Rotarian Joe Vinson brought a dose of much-needed sunshine on a rainy day, sharing a statement that resonated with all in attendance.

President Roberts encouraged members to participate in the raffle, where a lucky Rotarian won a dollar, though the elusive joker remained at large.

Rotarian Sherry Hartnett introduced Dr. Kuhl, highlighting his impressive accomplishments as a mathematician and dean.

Guest Speaker: Dr. Jaromy Kuhl, UWF Provost

Dr. Kuhl's presentation centered on UWF's innovative use of predictive analytics to drive student success. He explained how the university leverages data-driven strategies to identify students likely to succeed and those who may need additional support. By integrating descriptive, predictive, and prescriptive analytics, UWF has developed tools to enhance student outcomes and streamline strategic decision-making. Initially, UWF relied on shared spreadsheets to guide decisions, a process that was both inefficient and time-consuming. Recognizing these challenges, the university created a centralized dashboard system. This platform incorporates analytics, modeling, and customizable visualizations to empower administrators, faculty, and staff to collaborate effectively and holistically.

Key Features of the Dashboard:

Success Metrics: Offers detailed cohort profiles, including insights into students' academic backgrounds, risk levels, and progress. This feature

helps the university allocate resources effectively and provide targeted support for at-risk students.

Course Explorer: Enables administrators, department chairs, and deans to analyze course histories and patterns. This tool allows for optimized course offerings, improved resource allocation, and better academic support for students.

Metric Monitor: Tracks individual and cohort progress, providing an integrated view of student performance and program completion trends. This allows the university to identify areas requiring additional support or adjustments.

Dr. Kuhl also described UWF's use of predictive modeling to forecast student retention rates. These models, updated every semester to ensure accuracy, assess the likelihood of student

retention after the first year. By identifying at-risk students early, UWF can intervene with tailored support services, improving outcomes and aligning with institutional goals.

Beyond higher education, UWF has demonstrated the broader applicability of its analytics framework. By partnering with other universities and industries, including healthcare, the university has shown how data analysis and predictive modeling can inform decision-making in various contexts.

Dr. Kuhl concluded his remarks by emphasizing how UWF's innovative systems transform raw data into actionable insights, driving collaboration and fostering success. Following his presentation, he engaged with Rotarians in a Q&A session.

Closing

President Roberts thanked all those involved in organizing the meeting and adjourned the session at 12:55 PM.
