President Ray called the meeting to order and led the group in the Four Way Test. R.P. Doyle was then called to the podium to lead the club in prayer and pledge.

President Ray then called John Appleyard to the podium for the reading of a proclamation

honoring the life and times of distinguished club member Henry Cary who recently went to be with our Lord. The framed proclamation was presented to Sally Cary on behalf of her family.

President Ray then introduced our newest Paul Harris fellow, Don Hafercamp - congratulations Don!

President Ray then called Assistant District Governor Ted Kirkharr and Innes Richard to the podium. Innes informed the group of the upcoming Rotary Foundation Gala to be held in Tallahassee. Program Chairman David Stafford then introduced Lt. Tommy Liter and Officer Pierce Baker of the Community Services Unit of the Pensacola Police Department. This unit focuses on gang activity and consists of 8 officers and 2 sergeants. Gang activity is defined in Florida State Statute 874.03. There are 6 recognized gangs operating in the city and they are defined by the areas in which they reside. Pensacola Village is the oldest gang in town and is identified by their symbol, PCV which is tattooed on members of the group. This group is known for street level narcotics dealing and robbery. Another group is the Attucks Court Posse identified by their ACP tattoo. The A Street gang uses the ABC symbol and uses the color black as their identifier. The Neighborhood Terrorists, or NHT, are organized by a rank system based on seniority in the gang. The Outlaws - Black Pistons are a national gang which has been at war with the Hells Angels for many years.

members of this gang migrate to Pensacola from other states usually after committing crimes and attempting to avoid capture from outside law enforcement agencies. Lt. Liter mentioned the zero tolerance policy for gang dress and gang activity within the Escambia County school system. The unit works closely with the State Attorney's office to educate the public via presentations at neighborhood meetings, PTA meetings and within the public schools.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
