The principals taught are: honesty, integrity, sportsmanship, respect, confidence, responsibility, perseverance, courtesy and judgment. Kids move from basic to advanced levels of golf while learning the other character skills along the way. Local school physical ed classes can also be involved with this program.

Locally there are four program sites which are expected to be expanded by growing into other area counties. Of the 1617 enrollees, 565 were minorities and 205 were females. Funds are raised through community involvement. Joe Durant will be accompanied by other professional golfers for a Pro-am tournament at Pensacola Country Club that is to be announced shortly.
